If the student's behavior "impedes" (gets in the way of) their ability to learn or for peers to learn, strategies need to be put into place for the student.

Did You Know?!

A student may need **Related Services** in their Individualized Education Program (IEP) to benefit from their education.

A **Related Service** is to assist a student with a disability to benefit from special education. A related service helps a student reach their IEP Goals. It can be in many forms. i.e. counseling services, audiology, transportation, assistive technology, occupational therapy, school health services, etc.
