Did You Know?!

Disciplinary Appeals are for all students. General Education & Special Education Student's.

Did You Know?!

Special Education Student's have the right to Disciplinary Appeals and Manifestation Determination Reviews (MDR) at the same time. One doesn't 'offset' the other.

Did You Know?!

Even if a Special Education Student's behavior is found to be a Manifestation of their Disability, the student or parent may continue with a Disciplinary Appeal.

<p>Important: Time limits are extremely important to follow if a student or parent plan on appealing any disciplinary action.</p>

Emergency Expulsions

Please see Washington Administrative Code (WAC) under WAC 392-400-525

Time limit. A school district may establish a time limit to appeal an emergency expulsion. Appeal time limits must be no less than three school business days from the date the school district provides the written notice of the emergency expulsion.

Suspensions and Expulsions

Please see Washington Administrative Code (WAC) under WAC 392-400-465

Time limit. A school district may establish a time limit to appeal a suspension or expulsion. Appeal time limits must be no less than five school business days from the date the school district provides the written notice under WAC 392-400-455.

School business day means any calendar day, except Saturdays, Sundays, or any federal, state, or school holiday, when the office of the superintendent of a school district is open to the public for business

School day means any day or partial day that students are in attendance at school for instructional purposes
